This year Ash Wednesday falls on February 14th, which for many is a point of irony. As I watch as colleagues question their schedules and liturgies for Ash Wednesday services, I can't help but feel the connection appropriate. God's love for us is complete and radical, and the Lenten season is an opportunity for us to reflect of all that has God has done and all that Jesus sacrificed in the name of that love. I pray that you will take time out from your Valentine's Day to attend one of our two Ash Wednesday services, one at noon in Fellowship Hall and the other at 7 PM in the choir room, as we prepare our hearts and minds for this Lenten season.

Our sermon series through the season of Lent is titled *Through the Valley*. We will look at the emotion of lament and how it is a deeply human response to our suffering, one that many of us no longer make space for in our busy lives. How would our healing from life's harshness be fuller and more empowering if we allowed ourselves to feel our lament? And how will our relationship with our Creator be enriched by inviting God to join us there? Join us as we reflect on these questions over the 40 Days of Lent.



A Guy named Bill

His name is Bill. He has wild hair, wears a T-shirt with holes in it, jeans and no shoes. This was literally his wardrobe for his entire four years of college.

He is brilliant. Kinda esoteric and very, very bright. He became a Christian while attending college. Across the street from the campus is a well-dressed, very conservative church. They want to develop a ministry to the students, but are not sure how to go about it.

One day **B**ill decides to go there. He walks in with no shoes, jeans, his T-shirt, and wild hair. The service has already started and so Bill starts down the aisle looking for a seat. The church is completely packed and he can't find a seat. By now people are looking a bit uncomfortable, but no one says anything.

Bill gets closer and closer and closer to the pulpit and when he realizes there are no seats, he just squats down right on the carpet. (Although perfectly acceptable behavior at a college fellowship, trust me, this had never happened in this church before!) By now the people are really uptight, and tension in the air is thick.

About this time, the minister realizes that from way at the back of the church, a deacon is slowly making his way toward Bill. Now the deacon is in his eighties, has silver-gray hair, a three-piece suit, and a pocket watch. A godly man - very elegant, very dignified, very courtly. He walks with a cane and as he starts walking toward this boy, everyone is saying to themselves, You can't blame him for what he's going to do. How can you expect a man of his age and of his background to understand some college kid on the floor?

It takes a long time for the man to reach the boy. The church is utterly silent except for the clicking of the man's cane. All eyes are focused on him; you can't even hear anyone breathing. The people are thinking, The minister can't even preach the sermon until the deacon does what he has to do.

And now they see this elderly man drop his cane on the floor. With great difficulty he lowers himself and sits down next to Bill and worships with him so he won't be alone. Everyone chokes up with the emotion. When the minister gains control he says, "What I'm about to preach, you will never remember. What you have just seen, you will never forget."


