my home. What else could you ask for? Everyone is so busy and has their own things to deal with. But I want to thank all of you for making this shut in's year more bearable.



#### Just an FYI -

WASHINGTON, DC — the United States Postal Service filed notice with the Postal Regulatory Commission (PRC) of mailing services price changes to take **effect Jan. 21, 2024.** The new rates include a 2-cent increase in the price of a First-Class Mail Forever stamp, from 66 cents to 68 cents.

The proposed adjustments, approved by the governors of the Postal Service, would raise mailing services product prices approximately 2 percent. If favorably reviewed by the commission, the price changes would include:

U.S. Postal Service Proposes New Prices for 2024

Product	<b>Current Prices</b>	Planned Prices
Letters (1 ounce)	66 cents	68 cents
Letters (metered 1 ounce)	63 cents	64 cents
Domestic Postcards	51 cents	53 cents
International Postcards	\$1.50	\$1.55
International Letter (1 ounce)	\$1.50	\$1.55

There will be no change to the additional-ounce price, which remains at 24 cents. The Postal Service is also seeking price adjustments for Special Services products including Certified Mail, Post Office Box rental fees, money order fees and the cost to purchase insurance when mailing an item.
