FROM THE INTERN PASTOR'S DESK:

Hello Family:

As we begin this Lenten season, we may wonder what the meaning of Lent is. Lent is a 40 day period that starts on Ash Wednesday and goes to Good Friday. This basically models Christ's 40 day fast in the desert. It calls us to open our hearts to God's refining grace through prayer, confession, fasting, and almsgiving as we anticipate Holy Week. The official color of Lent is purple. Purple is the color of repentance for sins and also symbolizes the state of our souls outside the light of Christ. During this time, we should pray for those who do not know Christ and for those who have sinned against Him. Fasting is not typically practiced much anymore. A very important element of the Lenten season is becoming aware of not only the suffering and sacrifice of Christ but also to the suffering of others. Lent is a time to open the doors of our hearts a little wider and understand our Lord a little deeper, so that when Good Friday and eventually Easter comes, it is not just another day at church but an opportunity to receive the overflowing of graces God has to offer.

Today, we should use Lent as a time for prayer and penance. It is common these days for believers to surrender a particular vice such as favorite foods or smoking. Whatever a person's sacrifice is, it is a reflection of Jesus' deprivation in the wilderness and a test of self-discipline. My thoughts to you, instead of trying to give something up, that we go right back to after these 40 days are over, why don't we add something to our lives. Choose to be more vigilant in reading your Bible or devotionals. Take the time to WRITE, yes write, a hand written note every day to a person in your life who means something to you. Take the time to make someone happy every day; help your neighbor, hold open the door for someone who needs help, go out of your way to make a difference in someone's life. Then, maybe, this will become a good habit to continue long after these 40 days are over.

Some Things You May Not Know about Leap Year

Nearly every four years, we add an extra day to the calendar in the form of February 29, also known as Leap Day. Put simply, these additional 24 hours are built into the calendar to ensure that it stays in line with the Earth's movement around the Sun. While the modern calendar contains 365 days, the actual time it takes for Earth to orbit its star is slightly longer—roughly 365.2421 days. The difference might seem negligible, but over decades and centuries that missing quarter of a day per year can add up. To ensure consistency with the true astronomical year, it is necessary to periodically add in an extra day to make up the lost time and get the calendar back in synch with the heavens.

Curiously, many Leap Day customs have revolved around romance and marriage. Tradition holds that in 5th-century Ireland, St. Bridget lamented to St. Patrick that women were not allowed to propose marriage to men. So legend has it that St. Patrick designated the only day that does not occur annually, February 29, as a day on which women would be allowed to propose to men. In some places, Leap Day thus became known as Bachelor's Day.

There are only about 5 million people in the whole world who were born on February 29, with the odds of being born on Leap Day standing at about 1-in-1,461. Several famous people—including actress and singer Dinah Shore (born 1916), motivational speaker Tony Robbins (born 1960) and hip-hop artist Ja Rule (born 1976)—are leaplings. Leaplings technically only get to celebrate their birthdays once every four years, but they do get to be part of an elite group.



The Lovefeast was a form of religious assembly, where groups of worshipers came together to eat food and praise God. Although the origins are with Jesus and his of sharing bread with his disciples, it was the Moravians in Germany in the early part of the 18th century who established the practice as a way of bonding worshipers.

John Wesley first encountered Lovefeasts among the Moravians in Savannah, Georgia, around 1737. His diary notes: 'After evening prayers, we joined with the Germans in one of their love-feasts. It was begun and ended with thanksgiving and prayer, and celebrated in so decent and solemn a manner as a Christian of the apostolic age would have allowed to be worthy of Christ.'

The Lovefeast became a regular part of the Methodist scene and among offshoot groups, including Wesleyans, Independents, Primitives, New Connexion, and Bible Christians. It was an opportunity for the worshipers to enjoy each other's company, as well as give testimony to God's grace, hear exhortations, and to learn about the spiritual lives of others. Hymns, songs, and other forms of praise would be given – and food would be eaten.

A large communal cup of water was also often passed around. From 1830 onward the more affluent chapels often acquired their own two-handed tankards, made of white earthenware with hand-painted inscriptions recording the name of the chapel and the word 'Love-Feast'.
